Museum Receives Donation from Carter Family



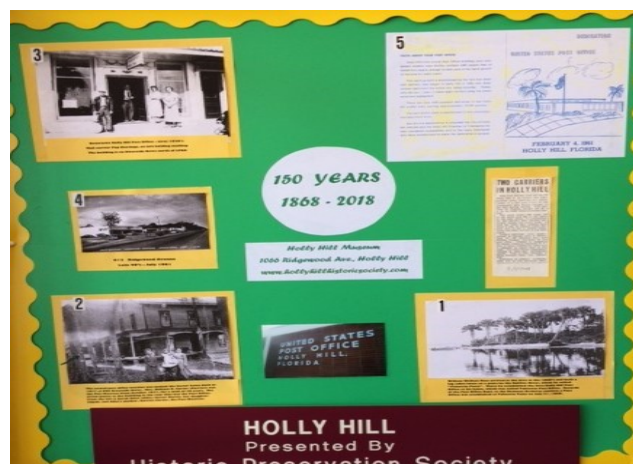

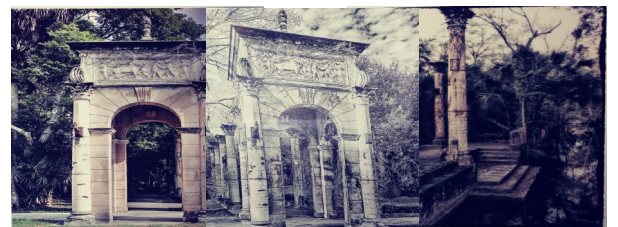
