Holly Hill Celebrates 1901 Birthday

In June 1875, the administrators of the Chaires estate sold the Fitch grant to William Samuel and Mary Fleming, residents of New Castle County, Delaware. After the Flemings completed the transaction for \$10,000, they constructed a simple wood frame dwelling on their newly acquired property in the Fitch grant, which would later become Holly Hill.

Aware of the potential for more land sales and a need to divide their holdings into smaller, more manageable lots, the Flemings subdivided the Fitch grant in November 1875. They then set out to convince more settlers to relocate to Florida.


In the summer of 1876 Fleming went to Philadelphia, which was celebrating America's centennial, with the express purpose of influencing settlers to come to his settlement in Florida. He gained the promise of fifteen families. Among them were the Wetherells and the Simcoes. Two other families that Fleming influenced were the Monroes and the Woods. It is notable the Monroes were quite possibly related to James Monroe, the 5th U.S. President.

Holly Hill had no name at this time. In discussion among the settlers, Mrs. Monroe would like to have had it named New Port News after her old home. This was a popular way of naming towns at this time. The settlers however decided that since Mr. Fleming owned nearly all the land and was the colony founder he should have the naming privilege.

Mr. Fleming chose the name Holly Hill in memory of his ancestral home in Holywood, Ireland. He was born there in Holywood (pronounced Hollywood), on the coast of Northern Ireland near Belfast. The new colony reminded him of his Irish home because there was an abundance of holly in the area and a rise in the terrain near the water.

William Samuel Fleming died December 22, 1877, before construction was completed on his home in the city that he named. On July 1, 1901 the settlement was officially incorporated as the City of Holly Hill.


