Historic Landmark Plaques Presented

Congratulations to Jessica Day and Chuck Ikes who were presented with historic landmark plaques by the Holly Hill Historic Society. Their historic homes are a testament to the history of Holly Hill. Mr. Ikes owns the Bill McCoy House at 1090 Riverside Drive. The famous rumrunner popularized the phrase "The Real McCoy" and operated a boat works on his property (insert). Built circa 1898.



Ms. Day owns the Janoski Cottage House at 416 Daytona Avenue built in 1920. The Janoski family opened the first motor court in Holly Hill, Greenland Tourist Court, in 1933.



Bike Week Roars Off.....and Spring Blossoms.

Recognize this stallion statue? It stood in front of Rocky's Boots for decades and was a landmark at 918 Ridgewood Avenue. Rocky's Shoe Service and Western Store was owned by Rocco Maenza. When the business closed the statue was moved to the Iron Horse Saloon in Ormond Beach on US1 where it still watches the leather crowd from the rear roof.

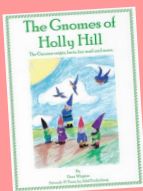

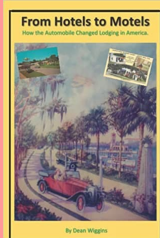

Easter in Holly Hill

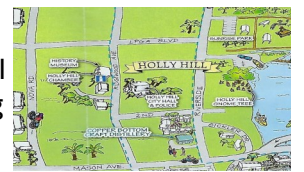
The 19th Annual Easter Egg Hunt took place on the City Hall lawn on April 9th. This continues the tradition from the 1920's. Holly Hill nurseries were also one of the largest producers of Easter Lilies and palms in America. Jungle Gardens shipped over 45,000 bulbs each year. Sallas Nursery supplied more than a million palms for Palm Sundays.
